### BETH YW LLAWYSGRIF?

Cyfrol wedi ei hysgrifennu â llaw, neu gasgliad o ddogfennau wedi eu dwyn ynghyd i ffurfio cyfrol yw llawysgrif fel arfer. Mae llawysgrifau yn cael eu cadw ar wahân i gasgliadau archifau'r Llyfrgell, er bod y berthynas rhyngddynt yn agos.

Ysgrifennwyd llawysgrifau'r Llyfrgell ar bapur, memrwn, papyri, dail, llechi ac amryfal gyfryngau eraill. Mae gennym hefyd enghreifftiau o lawysgrifau mewn amryw o wahanol ieithoedd, gan gynnwys Cymraeg, Saesneg, Lladin, Ffrangeg a Chernyweg.

## MANUSCRIPTS

### GENERAL INTRODUCTION

The National Library of Wales has thousands of manuscripts, which form the biggest and most important collection of Welsh manuscripts in the world.

Although Welsh items form the heart of the collection, it also includes many items that have no connection with Wales.

There are approximately 25,000 manuscripts in The National Library of Wales:

- The oldest dates from 113 A.D. (NLW MS 4738D)
- The latest dates from the year 2004 (NLW MS 23933D)

### WHAT IS A MANUSCRIPT?

A manuscript is usually a volume written by hand, or a collection of documents brought together to form a volume. Manuscripts are kept separately from the Library's archive collections, although the relationship between them is close.

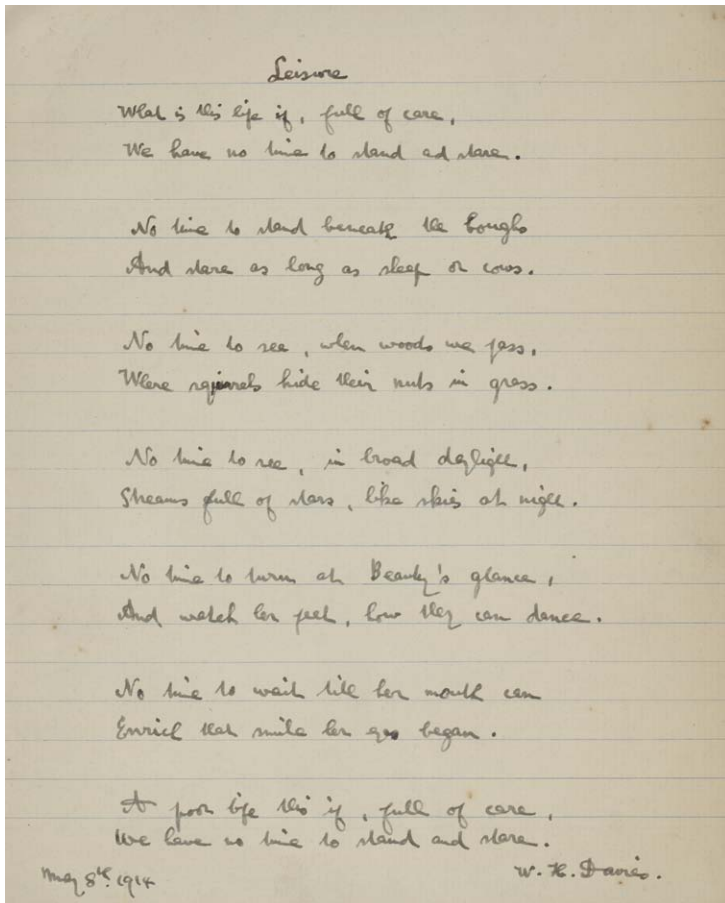
The Library's manuscripts are written on paper, parchment, papyri, leaves, slate and various other media. We also have examples of manuscripts in various languages, including Welsh, English, Latin, French and Cornish.

Wedi sicrhau tocyn darllen, darllenir llawysgrifau yn Ystafell Ddarllen y De yn y Llyfrgell. Mae yno gyfarpar arbennig, megis lamp uwch-fioled, i hwyluso'r gwaith o astudio'r deunydd cynharaf, yn ogystal â chyfeirlyfrau hwylus y gellir ymgynghori â hwy wrth ymchwilio.

Cyfyngir mynediad at rai llawysgrifau oherwydd eu hoed a'u cyflwr, a darperir copïau dirprwyol (digidol neu ficroffilm) ohonynt ar gyfer darllenwyr.

## HOW TO FIND THEM?

By now all the Library's new manuscript acquisitions are catalogued electronically, and more and more previous descriptions are being added to the database, and reviewed.

Access to those manuscripts which have been catalogued is available online by searching the Library's full catalogue:

It is possible to search for names, subjects and place-names, and free text searches can also be made. Also, in the reading room, you may browse early descriptions published in a number of different paper catalogues

## WHERE CAN YOU READ THE MANUSCRIPTS?

After you have secured your reader's ticket, manuscripts are read in the South Reading Room in the Library. There you will find special equipment, such as an ultra-violet lamp, to facilitate the work of studying the earliest material, along with convenient reference books that you may refer to whilst researching.

Access to some manuscripts is restricted because of their age and condition, and surrogate copies (digital or microfilm) are provided for readers.

## NLW MANUSCRIPT SERIES

This is an open-ended series of manuscripts, received by donation or purchase. They are usually manuscript volumes or rolls, or unbound material which can be bound or filed and which is not part of an archive or collection.

Most of the Library's literary, historical and antiquarian manuscripts may be found among the NLW Manuscript Series.

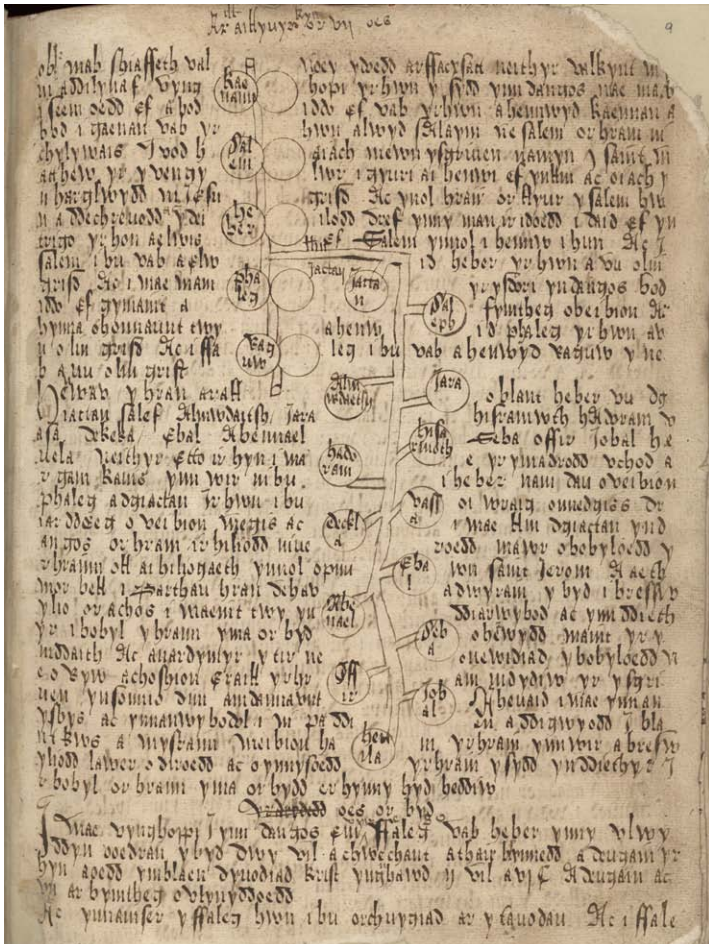

Mae'r dosbarth hwn yn cynnwys llawysgrifau na chynhwysir ymhlith Llawysgrifau NLW. Y mathau o lawysgrif a roddir yn y dosbarth hwn gan amlaf yw:

- llyfrau lloffion
- traethodau ymchwil
- papurau ymchwil

Parhad ydyw o gyfres gaeëdig a adwaenir fel 'Miscellaneous Volumes' (neu 'Misc. Vols', rhifau 1–415), ac fe ddechreu'r gyfres gyda NLW ex 416.

## RHOLIAU NLW

## FFACSIMILÏAU (NLW FACS)

Mae'r dosbarth hwn yn cynnwys ffotograffau, ffotostatau a llungopiâu o lawysgrifau ac archifau mewn llyfrgelloedd ac archifdai, ac o eitemau sydd mewn dwylo preifat.

## NLW EX SERIES OF MANUSCRIPTS

This category includes manuscripts which are not included amongst the NLW Manuscripts. These manuscripts include:

- volumes of newspaper cuttings
- scrap books
- research theses
- research papers

This is a continuation of a closed series known as 'Miscellaneous Volumes' (or 'Misc. Vols', numbers 1–415), and the series begins with NLW ex 416.

## NLW ROLLS

A varied collection of 305 items, which includes:

- pedigree rolls, from the 15th to the 20th centuries
- orations
- eastern rolls
- palm leaf books
- some items that are not manuscripts

Since 1981 the oldest and most precious rolls have been incorporated in the NLW manuscript series, size G.

There are also in the Library two important series of manuscript reproductions, namely:

## NLW FACSIMILES

This class consists of photographs, photostats and photocopies of manuscripts and archives kept in other libraries and record offices, and of items which are in private hands.

Cnewyllyn y casgliad yw microffilmiau o lawysgrifau Cymraeg a llawysgrifau o ddiddordeb Cymreig sydd mewn llyfrgelloedd pwysig eraill.

Ar wahân i lawysgrifau'r Llyfrgell Brydeinig (NLW Film BL) a llawysgrifau Caerdydd (DC), mae'r deunydd yma i gyd yn gwynysedig yn y gyfres NLW Film.

## LLAWYSGRIFAU PENIARTH

Llawysgrifau Peniarth yw casgliad pwysicaf y Llyfrgell o lawysgrifau. Fe'i sefydlwyd gan Robert Vaughan (c.1592–1667), Hengwrt, Meirionnydd, a gasglodd i'w lyfrgell lawysgrifau mewn:

- Saesneg, e.e. The Hengwrt Chaucer (Peniarth MS 392)
- Lladin, e.e. Cyfraith Hywel Dda (Peniarth MS 28)
- Cernyweg, e.e. Beunans Meriasek (Peniarth MS105)

Diddordeb pennaf Vaughan serch hynny oedd y Gymraeg. Casglodd i Hengwrt nifer helaeth iawn o'n llawysgrifau Cymraeg pwysicaf, gan gynnwys:

- Llyfr Du Caerfyrddin (Peniarth MS 1), y llawysgrif Gymraeg gynharaf
- Llyfr Taliesin (Peniarth 2), sy'n cynnwys y farddoniaeth Gymraeg hynaf

## MICROFILMS OF MANUSCRIPTS OF WELSH INTEREST

The heart of the collection consists of microfilms of manuscripts in the Welsh language and manuscripts of Welsh interest which are in other important libraries.

Apart from the British Library manuscripts (NLW Film BL) and Cardiff manuscripts (DC), all this material is included in the NLW Film series.

## PENIARTH MANUSCRIPTS

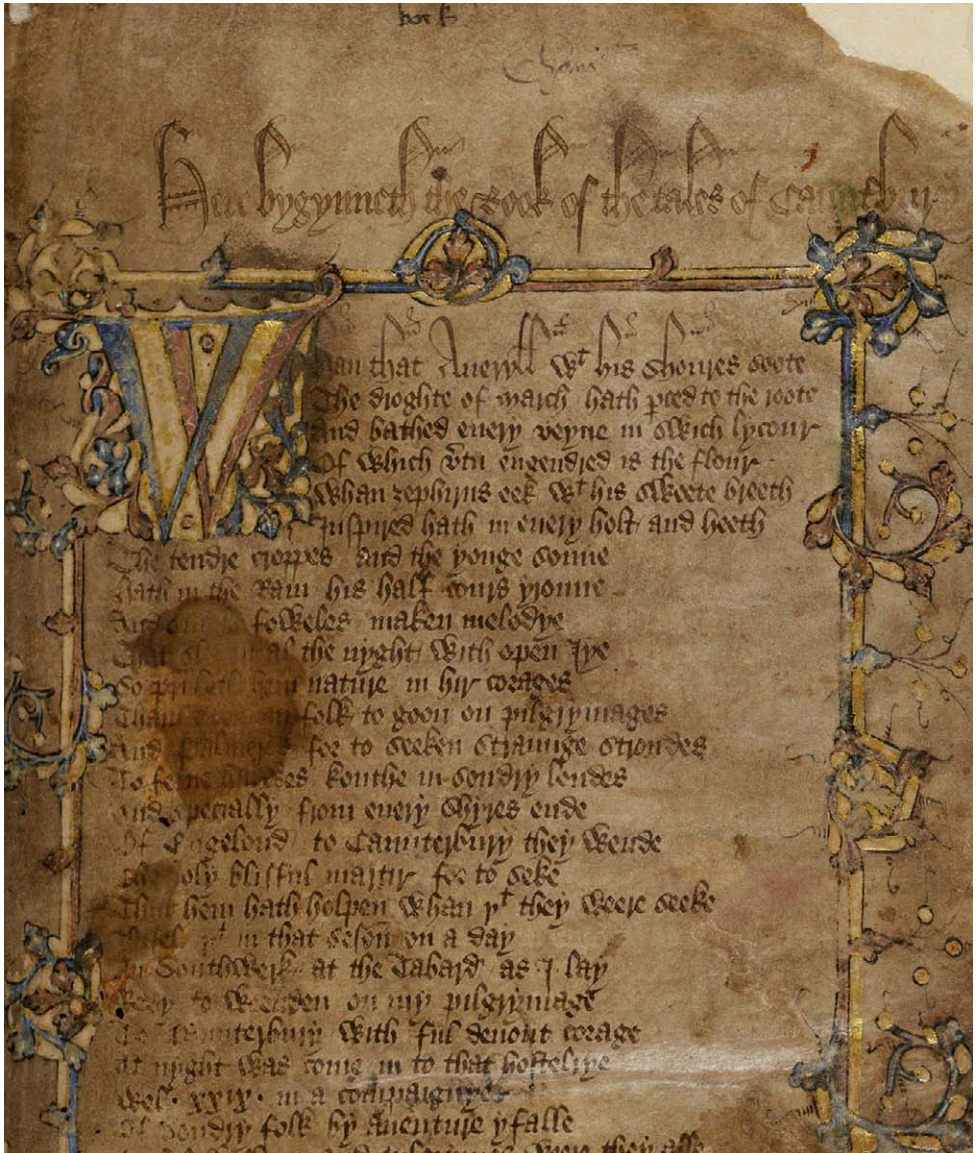
The Peniarth Manuscripts form the most important of the Library's manuscript collections. The collection was established by Robert Vaughan (c.1592–1667), Hengwrt, Meirioneth, who gathered for his library manuscripts in the following languages:

- English, e.g. The Hengwrt Chaucer (Peniarth MS 392)
- Latin, e.g. The Law of Hywel Dda (Peniarth MS 28)
- Cornish, e.g. Beunans Meriasek (Peniarth MS 105)

Vaughan's main interest, however, was the Welsh language. He collected at Hengwrt a great number of our most significant Welsh language manuscripts, including:

- The Black Book of Carmarthen (Peniarth MS 1), the earliest manuscript in the Welsh language
- The Book of Taliesin (Peniarth MS 2), which includes the oldest Welsh verse





- Llyfr Gwyn Rhydderch (Peniarth MS 4), sy'n cynnwys fersiwn cynharaf Pedair Cainc y Mabinogi
- Brut y Tywysogion (Peniarth MS 20), y cronicl cynharaf o hanes Cymru

Diogelwyd y llawysgrifau yn Hengwrt am genedlaethau, ac ychwanegwyd atynt rai cyfrolau eraill tros y blynyddoedd. Pan fu farw Syr Robert Williams Vaughan o Hengwrt ym 1859, ac yntau heb etifedd, gadawodd y casgliad i'w gyfaill W. W. E. Wynne, a symudodd y llawysgrifau i lyfrgell Peniarth, Meirionnydd.

Prynwyd y cyfan gan Syr John Williams (1840–1926) ym 1904. Pan fu farw W. R. M. Wynne, mab hynaf W. W. E. Wynne, ym 1909, trosglwyddwyd y llawysgrifau o Beniarth i'r Llyfrgell Genedlaethol newydd yn Aberystwyth.

Yn 2010, cydnabuwyd pwysigrwydd a gwerth eithriadol llawysgrifau Peniarth gan Sefydliad Addysg, Gwyddoniaeth a Diwylliant y Cenhedloedd Unedig (UNESCO) trwy enwi'r casgliad ar 'Restr Cof y Byd'.

- The White Book of Rhydderch (Peniarth MS 4), which includes the earliest version of the Four Branches of the Mabinogi
- The Chronicle of the Princes (Peniarth MS 20), the earliest chronicle of Welsh history

The manuscripts were preserved at Hengwrt for generations, and some other volumes were added to them over the years. When Sir Robert Williams Vaughan of Hengwrt died in 1859, without an heir, he left the collection to his friend W. W. E. Wynne, who moved the manuscripts to the Peniarth Library, Meirioneth.

The whole collection was bought by Sir John Williams (1840–1926) in 1904. When W. R. M. Wynne, the eldest son of W. W. E. Wynne, died in 1909, the manuscripts were transferred from Peniarth to the new National Library at Aberystwyth.

In 2010, the Peniarth manuscripts were recognised by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) as being of outstanding value and importance, and the collection was added to the 'Memory of the World Register'.

- Peter Bailey Williams (1723–96)

## THE CWRTMAWR MANUSCRIPTS

This is the personal collection of John Humphreys Davies (1871–1926), Cwrtmawr. He was Principal of University College, Aberystwyth and one of The National Library of Wales' greatest benefactors.

The collection includes the manuscripts of:

- John Jones, 'Myrddin Fardd' (1836–1921)
- Peter Bailey Williams (1723–96)
- William John Roberts, 'Gwilym Cowlyd' (1828–1904)
- Daniel Silvan Evans (1818–1903)

Trosglwyddwyd rhan gyntaf llawysgrifau Cwrwmawr i'r Llyfrgell Genedlaethol ym 1925 (llsgrau. 1–50), a throsglwyddwyd y gweddill (llsgrau. 51–1492) ar ôl marw J. H. Davies ym 1926.

## THE LLANSTEPHAN MANUSCRIPTS

## LLAWYSGRIFAU LLANSTEPHAN

Casgliad Llanstephan yw casgliad personol Syr John Williams, prif gymwynaswr y Llyfrgell Genedlaethol. Bu Syr John yn byw am flynyddoedd ym mhlasty Llanstephan, sir Gaerfyrddin.

Mae'r casgliad yn cynnwys:

- casgliad llawysgrifau Samuel Williams (c.1660–c.1722) a'i fab Moses Williams (1685–1742) a brynwyd gan Syr John o gasgliad Castell Shirburn ym 1899 (Llanstephan MSS 1–154)
- amryfal llawysgrifau eraill a gasglwyd gan Syr John, gan gynnwys rhai o llawysgrifau Lewis Morris (1701–65) a Walter Davies, 'Gwallter Mechain' (1761–1849) (Llanstephan MSS 155–200)

Cyflwynwyd y casgliad i Lyfrgell Genedlaethol Cymru ym 1909. Ymysg y llawysgrifau mae:

- Brut y Brenhinedd (Llanstephan MS 1)
- Llyfr Coch Talgarth (Llanstephan MS 27)
- Llawysgrif Gutun Owain (Llanstephan MS 28)

Ymgorfforwyd llawysgrifau eraill o gasgliad Syr John Williams (gan gynnwys amryw a brynwyd ganddo yn arwerthiannau Syr Thomas Phillips) yng nghyfres Llawysgrifau NLW (rhifau 1–500).

The Llanstephan Collection is the personal collection of Sir John Williams, the main benefactor of The National Library of Wales. Sir John lived for many years at Llanstephan mansion, Carmarthenshire.

The collection consists of:

- the manuscripts of Samuel Williams (c.1660–c.1722) and his son, Moses Williams (1685–1742), bought by Sir John from the Shirburn Castle collection in 1899 (Llanstephan MSS 1–154)
- various other manuscripts collected by Sir John, including some manuscripts which belonged to Lewis Morris (1701–65) and Walter Davies ('Gwallter Mechain'), 1761–1849 (Llanstephan MSS 155–200)

The collection was presented to The National Library in 1909. Among the manuscripts are:

- Chronicle of the Kings (Llanstephan MS 1)
- The Red Book of Talgarth (Llanstephan MS 27)
- The Gutun Owain Manuscript
- (Llanstephan MS 28)

Other manuscripts from Sir John Williams' collection (including many that were bought by him at auctions of Sir Thomas Phillips' manuscripts) are in the NLW Manuscripts series (numbers 1–500).
